



# Music Notes by Ray Urwin

Today's Prelude is one of Bach's finest organ pieces. It's based on a Lutheran version of the Nicene Creed with its Trinitarian structure. And our entrance hymn, *Holy, holy, holy (Nicaea)*, often regarded as the archetypal Victorian hymn tune, is the hymn for Trinity Sunday. The composer, John B. Dykes, was prolific, with twelve tunes in our current book and twice as many in the 1940 hymnal. Nicaea and Eternal Father, strong to save (the Navy Hymn, No. 579) are his best-known tunes, but he wrote many others, including Ride on, ride on in majesty, Take my life, and let it be (707), Shepherd of souls, refresh and bless (343), Sing, my soul, his wondrous love (467), and O for a closer walk with God (683). There are several other hymn tunes which also begin the same way as Nicaea, with a triad (the 1st, 3rd, and 5th notes of a scale) - a musical symbol of the Trinity, according to early music theorists. And there were several other similar tunes written for these words about ten years before Dykes' tune - all beginning with these same triad notes! The similarity of all of these tunes may simply mean that each composer independently came to a similar conclusion regarding these Trinitarian words, but their similarity, and when they were written, suggest that Dykes knew at least one of the others, though which one is unknown, as he left no account of his compositional process. *Nicaea's* author was Reginald Heber (1783-1826), who was Bishop of Calcutta in the early 19th century, and also wrote the hymns Brightest and best, Bread of the world (301), and Hosanna to the living Lord (486, another Dykes/Heber pairing). Today's Offertory Anthem by Heinrich Schütz is from his Becker Psalter of 1628, a collection of psalm paraphrases by his contemporary, Cornelius Becker. In keeping with the flexibility required by the Thirty Years War (1618-1648), Schütz harmonized his original unison tunes and chorales in four parts for the collection, so they could be sung by a choir or by solo voice with continuo (keyboard and a bass instrument) playing the harmony.




