

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all. He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts. Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom. All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. *AMEN*.

THE BREAKING OF THE BREAD

Celebrant Alleluia. Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us;People Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia.

Celebrant The Gifts of God for the People of God. Take them in remembrance that

Christ died for you, and feed on him in your hearts by faith, with thanksgiving.

Wherever you are on your spiritual journey you are welcome to come forward and receive the consecrated wine and wafers. Wine will be served by our chalice bearer from the common cup. In keeping with the pandemic safety guidelines from our bishop, the communicant may drink from the chalice or, in the alternative, the priest will dip the wafer into the wine and place it directly on the communicant's tongue. If you prefer not to have wine, simply cross your arms over your chest after receiving the wafer.

From The Book of Common Prayer

The liturgy for the dead is an Easter liturgy. It finds all its meaning in the resurrection. Because Jesus was raised from the dead, we, too, shall be raised.

The liturgy, therefore, is characterized by joy, in the certainty that "neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord."

This joy, however, does not make human grief unchristian. The very love we have for each other in Christ brings deep sorrow when we are parted by death. Jesus himself wept at the grave of his friend. So, while we rejoice that one we love has entered into the nearer presence of our Lord, we sorrow in sympathy with those who mourn. (The Book of Common Prayer)

Edward Robert Woodson 1946-2022

Edward Robert Woodson passed away on May 27, 2022, following a two-year battle with esophageal cancer. A beloved husband, father, grandfather, great grandfather, and friend, Ed was born in Denver, Colorado, on January 12, 1946. He moved to the Orange County area of California as a child and spent the last 35 years in Costa Mesa.

Ed had a life-long love of education. After receiving his degree from Cal State Fullerton in 1968, Ed taught in the Anaheim Union School District for 40 years. Most of those years were at Western High School, where he left a rich legacy as a world history teacher. More recently, he was a well-regarded lecturer at Call State Fullerton's Osher Lifelong Learning Institute.

Ed was also an avid builder of scale model airplanes, which he flew at Lake Irvine. He served as the secretary of the Scale Squadron of Southern California and safety officer for the Orange County Modelers Association. Ed enjoyed traveling and attending UCLA sports events with his wife of 35 years, Jane Woodson, and never missed an episode of Jeopardy – where he always knew most of the answers.

Ed is survived by his wife, Jane; children, Tim Woodson and Janai Hellesto; stephchildren, Ann Shepphird and Mary Thomas; eight grandchildren and three great grandchildren.
