

The Great Thanksgiving




Worship and praise belong to you, Author of all being. Your power sustains, your love restores, our broken world. You are unceasingly at work, from chaos bringing order and filling emptiness with life.

Christ, raised from the dead, proclaims the dawn of hope. He lives in us that we may walk in light.

Your Spirit is fire in us, your breath is power to purge our sin and warm our hearts to love.

As children of your redeeming purpose, freed by him who burst from the tomb and opened the gate of life, we offer you our praise, with angels and archangels and the whole company of heaven, singing the hymn of your unending glory:



Praise and thanksgiving be to you, Lord of all, for by the Cross eternal life is ours and death is swallowed up in victory. In the first light of Easter glory broke from the tomb and changed the women's sorrow into joy. From the Garden the mystery shone clear that he whom they had loved and lost is with us now in every place for ever.

Making himself known in the breaking of the bread, speaking peace to the fearful disciples, greeting fishermen on the shore, he renewed the promise of his presence and of new birth in the Spirit who sets the seal of freedom on your sons and daughters. 



Music Notes by Ray Urwin

During an American concert tour in 1921, Marcel Dupré, the renowned organist at St. Sulpice in Paris, took suggestions from audience members for four melodies to improvise upon, at the famous organ inside the Wanamaker Department Store in Philadelphia. Two were Christmas melodies, and two were from Holy Week and Easter chants. Three years later he wrote out and published these improvisations as his *Symphonie-Passion*, Op. 23. The movements musically narrate the life of Christ; the finale blossoms into a cacophonous and inspiring depiction of the resurrection. (Gregg Wager / LA Phil, adapted)
