


Music Notes by Ray Urwin

In our three-year lectionary cycle Psalm 23 is usually used for the 4th Sundays of both the Lent and Easter seasons. Today's music includes two settings of the beloved psalm, the first (Offertory anthem) by the British composer Howard Goodall written for and used as the theme song for the British comedy *The Vicar of Dibley*. The second setting (Communion) is by the Jewish composer Debbie Friedman, sung in the original Hebrew. Friedman, a resident of Laguna Woods, died too young (aged 59), and her many beautiful songs are widely sung in the Conservative and Reform Jewish worlds. We sang this setting of the psalm a few years ago, and after the service our congregational member Bill Coté told me he free-lanced singing at churches and temples, including many times at hers, knew her well, and sang at her funeral. The psalm has been set to music innumerable times, including in the Hebrew in Leonard Bernstein's *Chichester Psalms*.


