





Praise and thanksgiving be to you, Lord of all, for by the Cross eternal life is ours and death is swallowed up in victory. In the first light of Easter glory broke from the tomb and changed the women's sorrow into joy. From the Garden the mystery shone clear that he whom they had loved and lost is with us now in every place for ever. Making himself known in the breaking of the bread, speaking peace to the fearful disciples, greeting fishermen on the shore, he renewed the promise of his presence and of new birth in the Spirit who sets the seal of freedom on your sons and daughters.

Help us, who are baptized into the fellowship of Christ's Body to live and work to your praise and glory; may we grow together in unity and love until at last, in your new creation, we enter into our heritage in the company of the Virgin Mary, St Michael and All Angels, the apostles, and prophets, and of all our brothers and sisters living and departed.



If you prefer not to have wine, simply cross your arms over your chest after receiving the wafer.

Music Notes by Ray Urwin

Our faithful choir volunteers are taking a much-deserved and needed day off today, and our alto, tenor, and bass section leaders are offering some unusual vocal music.

Johann Philipp Krieger (Offertory), a near contemporary of Bach, was a prolific court and church composer and organist, working in various places in Germany, including Weißenfells, where he was court composer for 45 years. He wrote much music, including more than 2000 cantatas, of which only 76 have survived. This duet, originally for two tenors, is from a cantata for the second Sunday of Easter, 1698. Claudio Casciolini (Communion) was a bass singer and possibly the choir director at San Lorenzo in Damaso, in central Rome. He and his wife had numerous children and lived in poverty in a small house near the church. Like the late Renaissance composer Tomas Luis de Victoria, Casciolini wrote only church music. Although he lived during the period of Baroque art, he was a conservative and wrote almost exclusively in the "antique" or late Renaissance style of Palestrina. This piece, however, with its chords and voices moving together like a hymn, is more Baroque than Renaissance.
