

¹This is the reason that I Paul am a prisoner for Christ Jesus for the sake of you Gentiles—²for surely you have already heard of the commission of God's grace that was given me for you, ³and how the mystery was made known to me by revelation, as I wrote above in a few words, ⁴a reading of which will enable you to perceive my understanding of the mystery of Christ. ⁵In former generations this mystery was not made known to humankind, as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit: ⁶that is, the Gentiles have become fellow heirs, members of the same body, and sharers in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel.

THE GOSPEL: Matthew 2:1-12

¹In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, ²asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage." ³When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; ⁴and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. ⁵They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet:

⁶'And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah,

are by no means least among the rulers of Judah;

for from you shall come a ruler

who is to shepherd my people Israel."

Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage." When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.

THE CREED



In Christ, your only begotten Son, you have revealed yourself to the world. By the leading of a star, you made him known to the nations as the son of David and king of Israel; that in following him, we might be led from darkness into his marvelous light.

Filled with the Spirit, who descended upon your Son at his Baptism in the Jordan, we who are baptised in his name strive for his heavenly kingdom in whose radiance we are transfigured and the earth transformed.

As children of your redeeming purpose who celebrate the epiphany of your Son, we offer you our praise, with angels and archangels and the whole company of heaven singing the hymn of your unending glory:



Glory and thanksgiving be to you, most loving Father. In Jesus the Messiah you have come to us. Our hope is built on him in whom you are well pleased.

Having been shown to the world as your beloved Son, he proclaimed the good news of your kingdom. The blind received their sight, the lame walked, the lepers were cleansed, and the captives set free. At his word, water became wine, the hungry were filled with bread, and the dead were raised.

Before he was given up to suffering and death, desiring to complete the work for which he came into the world, at supper with his disciples he took bread and offered you thanks. He broke the bread, and gave it to them, saying: "Take, eat. This is my Body: it is broken for you."

After supper, he took the cup, he offered you thanks, and gave it to them saying: "Drink this, all of you. This is my Blood of the new covenant; it is poured out for you, and for all, that sins may be forgiven. Do this in remembrance of me."

We now obey your Son's command.

All We recall his blessed passion and death, his glorious resurrection and ascension; and we look for the coming of his Kingdom.

Made one with him, we offer you these gifts and with them ourselves, a single, holy, living sacrifice.

Hear us, most merciful Father, and send your Holy Spirit upon us and upon this bread and this wine, that, overshadowed by your Spirit's life-giving power, they may be the Body and Blood of

your Son, and we may be kindled with the fire of your love and renewed for the service of your Kingdom.

Help us, who are baptised into the fellowship of Christ's Body to live and work to your praise and glory; may we grow together in unity and love until at last, in your new creation, we enter into our heritage in the company of the Virgin Mary, the apostles, and prophets, and of all our brothers and sisters living and departed.

Through Jesus Christ our Lord, with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be to you, Lord of all ages, world without end. *Amen*.





Fundraising Recap

Your dedication to the St. Michael's missions and ministries is on full display as we recap our fundraising efforts from the end of 2023. Your generosity ensures St. Michael's remains a beacon of hope and joy in our community through 2024 and beyond.

- Alternative Gift Fair: Held on Sunday, Nov. 19, our annual Alternative Gift Fair raised \$403.00 to benefit St. Michael's Missions Ministry.
- Adopt-a-Family: Our annual Christmas Adopt-a-Family drive raised \$2470.00 to benefit our adopted family through MOMS Orange County. (Read a thank you note from our adopted family and from MOMS OC on page 21.)
- Anne Conover Memorial: In lieu of flowers, Anne asked that donations be made to the St. Michael's Godly Play ministry. We received \$771.00 in donations that will be used to support and enhance our Godly Play program.
- Prayer Vigil for Peace: donations totaling \$2,787.00 were sent to Episcopal Relief and Development in 2023.
- Rector's Discretionary Fund: donations totaling \$1,605.04 were collected to assist the poor of the congregation and the larger community in 2023.
- United Thank Offering: St. Michael's raised \$400 for the Diocese of Jerusalem in the December UTO drive.
- Organ Repair Campaign: So far, we have received donations and pledges for our organ repair in the amount of \$136,980.
- 2024 Pledges: With a target of \$300,000, we have received \$304,935 to date in donations and pledges.

Sharing Spaces update

Saint Michael and All Angels has engaged LeSar Development Consultants of San Diego to conduct an affordable housing development feasibility study. The firm will conduct market research to determine appropriate assumptions for rent levels and construction costs. A proforma financial model will show anticipated development budget, financing sources, project revenue, and long-term cash flow. Concluding analysis will include an estimated financial return to the Church. Having an independent assessment will be helpful in any subsequent negotiations with a developer. LeSar's study is paid for by monies from the Blessings Fund gifted to St. Michael's by Dori Rodi-Shryock.

LeSar has a growing relationship providing real estate consulting services for faith-based institutions and with the Episcopal Church specifically. LeSar recently entered into an agreement with the Episcopal Diocese of San Diego. In December, LeSar presented their scope of services to the Episcopal Bishops of Province 8. LeSar provides expert real estate advisory services focused on addressing needs and outcomes including strategic considerations, site assessments, and standardized processes for considering development of church properties.


