<sup>8</sup> The trees once went out to anoint a king over themselves. So they said to the olive tree, 'Reign over us.' <sup>9</sup> The olive tree answered them, 'Shall I stop producing my rich oil by which gods and mortals are honored, and go to sway over the trees?' <sup>10</sup> Then the trees said to the fig tree, 'You come and reign over us.' <sup>11</sup> But the fig tree answered them, 'Shall I stop producing my sweetness and my delicious fruit, and go to sway over the trees?' <sup>12</sup> Then the trees said to the vine, 'You come and reign over us.' <sup>13</sup> But the vine said to them, 'Shall I stop producing my wine that cheers gods and mortals, and go to sway over the trees?' <sup>14</sup> So all the trees said to the bramble, 'You come and reign over us.' <sup>15</sup> And the bramble said to the trees, 'If in good faith you are anointing me king over you, then come and take refuge in my shade;

# Mark 1:29-45

<sup>29</sup> As soon as they<sup>[a]</sup> left the synagogue, they entered the house of Simon and Andrew, with James and John. <sup>30</sup> Now Simon's mother-in-law was in bed with a fever, and they told him about her at once. <sup>31</sup> He came and took her by the hand and lifted her up. Then the fever left her, and she began to serve them.

<sup>32</sup> That evening, at sunset, they brought to him all who were sick or possessed with demons. <sup>33</sup> And the whole city was gathered around the door. <sup>34</sup> And he cured many who were sick with various diseases, and cast out many demons; and he would not permit the demons to speak, because they knew him.

<sup>35</sup> In the morning, while it was still very dark, he got up and went out to a deserted place, and there he prayed. <sup>36</sup> And Simon and his companions hunted for him. <sup>37</sup> When they found him, they said to him, "Everyone is searching for you." <sup>38</sup> He answered, "Let us go on to the neighboring towns, so that I may proclaim the message there also; for that is what I came out to do." <sup>39</sup> And he went throughout Galilee, proclaiming the message in their synagogues and casting out demons.

<sup>40</sup> A leper<sup>[b]</sup> came to him begging him, and kneeling<sup>[c]</sup> he said to him, "If you choose, you can make me clean." <sup>41</sup> Moved with pity,<sup>[d]</sup> Jesus<sup>[e]</sup> stretched out his hand and touched him, and said to him, "I do choose. Be made clean!" <sup>42</sup> Immediately the leprosy<sup>[f]</sup> left him, and he was made clean. <sup>43</sup> After sternly warning him he sent him away at once, <sup>44</sup> saying to him, "See that you say nothing to anyone; but go, show yourself to the priest, and offer for your cleansing what Moses commanded, as a testimony to them." <sup>45</sup> But he went out and began to proclaim it freely, and to spread the word, so that Jesus<sup>[g]</sup> could no longer go into a town openly, but stayed out in the country; and people came to him from every quarter.
