
## Prayer Vigil for Ukraine

#### **Opening Prayer**

Tonight we join our prayer for justice and peace along with those from around the world.

Dear God, How can this happen? Again. How can we be no closer to your reign of peace? When will we ever learn? Are these the questions you, too, are asking?

We pray for those who have died by the violence of our fallen world; gather them into your arms and bless them. We pray for the schoolmates, families, friends and communities as they struggle their loss, with the mysteries of life and death; walk with them through the valley of the shadow of death. We pray for those who were witnesses to these horrors, for students, teachers, staff, ordinary citizens and first responders; gently heal the wounds of their minds and spirits. We pray for those who take the life of innocent victims, consumed by a hatred we cannot begin to understand; for your forgiveness that far exceeds any we can find in our hearts. Comfort us in our sadness, stand strong beside us in our fear, use our anger to fuel change, and do not let us give up hope for the day when all shall live in peace and safety. *Amen.*

Give grace to all whose lives are linked with ours.

May we serve Christ in one another and love as he loves us.

God of love, be with those affected by violence and war throughout the world.

Be with them to strengthen and uphold them.

Let us now name before God those for whom we offer our prayers, either silently or aloud. *The people may add their intercessions.* 

Loving God, Jesus gathered your little ones in his arms and blessed them. Have pity on all who mourn for those slaughtered by the violence of our fallen world. Be with us as we struggle with the mysteries of life and death; in our pain, bring your comfort, and in our sorrow, bring your hope and your promise of new life.

O God, you made us in your own image and redeemed us through Jesus your Son: Look with compassion on the whole human family; take away the arrogance and hatred which infect our hearts; break down the walls that separate us; unite us in bonds of love; and work through our struggle and confusion to accomplish your purposes on earth; that, in your good time, all nations and races may serve you in harmony around your heavenly throne; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.* 

#### A Reading from Paul's letter to the Romans

What then are we to say about these things? If God is for us, who is against us? He who did not withhold his own Son, but gave him up for all of us, will he not with him also give us everything else? Who will bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. Who is to condemn? It is Christ Jesus, who died, yes, who was raised, who is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us. Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, not height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

#### **Prayer of St. Francis**

Lord, make me an instrument of your peace:
where there is hatred, let me sow love;
where there is injury, pardon;
where there is doubt, faith;
where there is despair, hope;
where there is darkness, light;
where there is sadness, joy.
O divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek
to be consoled as to console,
to be understood as to understand,
to be loved as to love.
For it is in giving that we receive,
it is in pardoning that we are pardoned,
and it is in dying that we are born to eternal life. Amen.

Keep watch, dear Lord, with those who work, or watch, or weep this night, and give your angels charge over those who sleep. Tend the sick, Lord Christ; give rest to the weary, bless the dying, soothe the suffering, pity the afflicted, shield the joyous; and all for your love's sake. Amen.
