## FIRST READING: 1 Kings 19:15-16, 19-21

<sup>19</sup>So he set out from there, and found Elisha son of Shaphat, who was plowing. There were twelve yoke of oxen ahead of him, and he was with the twelfth. Elijah passed by him and threw his mantle over him. <sup>20</sup>He left the oxen, ran after Elijah, and said, “Let me kiss my father and my mother, and then I will follow you.” Then Elijah said to him, “Go back again; for what have I done to you?”

<sup>21</sup>He returned from following him, took the yoke of oxen, and slaughtered them; using the equipment from the oxen, he boiled their flesh, and gave it to the people, and they ate. Then he set out and followed Elijah, and became his servant.

factions, <sup>21</sup>envy, drunkenness, carousing, and things like these. I am warning you, as I warned  
you before: those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God.

<sup>22</sup>By contrast, the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity,  
faithfulness, <sup>23</sup>gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against such things. <sup>24</sup>And those who  
belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. <sup>25</sup>If we live by the  
Spirit, let us also be guided by the Spirit.

## **Music Notes by Ray Urwin**

Today's organ music is by the late Romantic composer Josef Rheinberger. The offertory fugue uses the letters of Bach's name as a theme. In German musical nomenclature B-A-C-H is B flat to A (a half step), to C (a minor third), to H (B natural in English note names). You can hear these first four notes and their intervals at the beginning and throughout the piece. This is one of many pieces by various composers through history paying tribute and homage to Bach. Bach himself also did this in some of his own pieces.

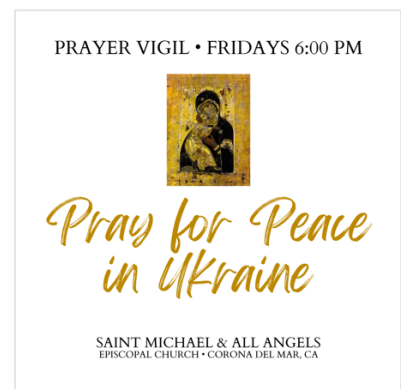
